CHURCH HISTORY

Established as an official church August 15, 1915 our church has a strong history of serving the needs of the community in which we live. The 2015 Centennial Celebration theme of “Serving Through the Generations” reflects the loving hands and hearts of this congregation. Over the years we have become a church family as we come together to serve all generations in Christian love.

In 1907 founding members of First United Methodist Church of Gilbert were meeting on the schoolhouse porch of Gilbert **Township** in the Arizona **Territory**. Arizona Territory was signed into statehood on February 14, 1912 by President William Howard Taft. Gilbert incorporated as a Town on July 6, 1920 with Everett Wilbur as the first mayor.

Mayor Wilbur was a forward thinking and kindhearted man who was a dedicated member of the Methodist Church. He was instrumental in acquiring our famous Gilbert Water Tower between 1925 and 1927. Ethyl Wilbur Mastin, the daughter of Wilbur and Nelly Wilbur, remained an active part of this church until her death in 2010.

Hanging in the narthex of our sanctuary you can enjoy a timeline of our church starting from 1907 and continuing through our Centennial Celebration in 2015. These framed pictures that depict our history were donated by our Women’s Christian Fellowship. There are many members of this fellowship who were friends with and served with Ethyl Wilbur Mastin.

This is a church with much-blessed roots. May you be blessed in your time with this church family as we continue a history of serving through the generations.

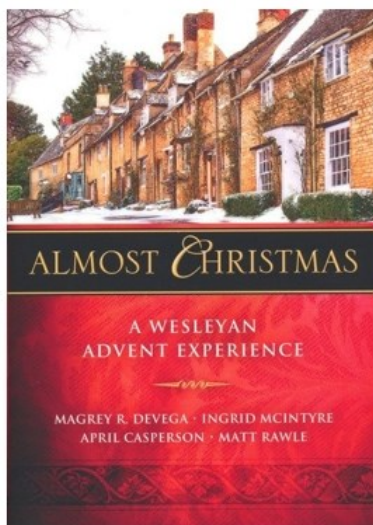

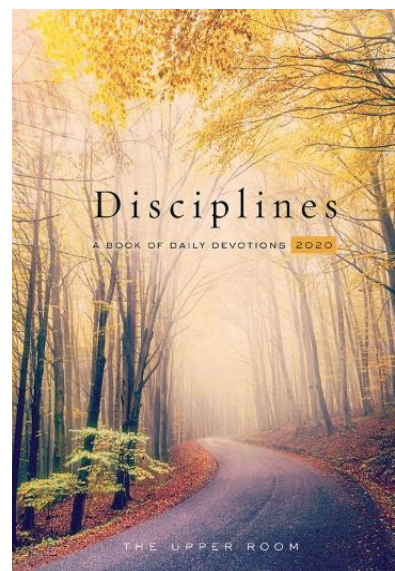

Helping the Church stay Healthy

FAQs about Flu season:

What is Influenza (Flu)?

Flu is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses that infect the nose, throat, and sometimes the lungs. It can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death.

What are symptoms of the Flu?

Fever, chills, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle aches, headaches, and fatigue. Vomiting is more common in children.



Do I really need a flu vaccine every year?

Yes. CDC recommends a yearly flu vaccine for just about every one 6 months or older. A person's immune protection from vaccination declines over time, so an annual vaccination is needed to get the best protection against the flu. The flu viruses are constantly changing, so the formulation of the flu vaccine is updated each year.

When do I get a flu vaccine?

Get vaccinated early in fall, before flu begins spreading in your community since it takes about two weeks after vaccination for antibodies to develop in the body and provide protection against flu. Vaccination is recommended by the end of October, but it is still beneficial and should continue to be offered throughout into January.

How can I prevent Flu?

Flu vaccine prevents millions of illnesses and doctor's visits each year. In 2016-2017, flu vaccination prevented an estimated 5.3 million influenza illnesses. An annual seasonal flu vaccine is the best way to protect against the flu. Additionally, please consider the pneumonia vaccine as well. Unfortunately, about 50,000 people die from pneumonia each year in the United States. Adults 65 years or older are more likely to get pneumonia.

How do flu vaccines work?

Flu vaccines cause antibodies to develop in the body about two weeks after vaccination. These antibodies provide protection against infection with the viruses that are in the vaccine. The seasonal flu vaccine protects against the influenza viruses that research indicates will be most common during the upcoming season.

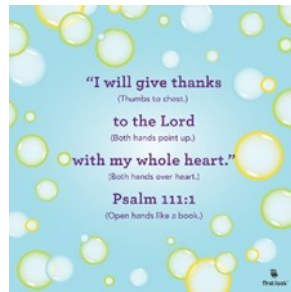
