Current Mission Team Efforts Gilbert Elementary School

Our church continues to support Gilbert Elementary School, which is a neighborhood Title 1 school. Schools meet criteria based on total student enrollment and the number of students qualifying for free and reduced lunch. We supply snacks to those students who are hungry and cannot concentrate on their studies. We would appreciate all donations. A list has been provided below. You may drop them off throughout the school year in the wooden crates on the wire shelves labeled Missions inside the doors of the Activity Center. The students are so polite and grateful when we deliver snacks to them. It's always a joy to see them!

Please note, all food items must be individually packaged. Supplies needed include peanut butter or cheese filled crackers, cups of Mac'n Chees (just add water), Cheez-Its, Goldfish, Pop Tarts, Fruit Snacks, granola bars, Gatorade, bottled water, and breakfast bars.

Community Wide Food Drive

The Mission Team is coordinating our church's participation in the Town of Gilbert's Community Wide Food Drive. This year we will be one of many churches and faith based organizations that will be a designated collection point from 9am—6pm on February 24th and 25th.

June Morrison turns 100 Years Old February 12, 2024. June has been a member of this church for 75 years. She has been active in the church and the community all of her life. She is an amazingly kind woman with a generous spirit. June is the only living person to have attended in all three locations of our church. Our first church building was built in 1919 and was sadly condemned in 1946. While the new church was being built on Main Street (Gilbert Road), she and the rest of the congregation attended services at the Tone Theatre building (Joe's Bar-B-Q). In 1986 June donated the five acres where the Church currently sits at 331 S. Cooper Road.

June has served on just about every committee the church has ever had. Finance, secretary, Stephen Ministry, calling on the sick, cleaning, or whatever needed to be done. She has served as pianist, organist, and choir director. June shared that once Richard managed to escape from the nursery and found his way up the aisle while June was playing the organ during church service. He knew exactly where to find his mother! At one time herself, her husband Marvin and their three sons made up half the choir.

June helped Alice Stevenson, our first parish nurse, to start the health ministry in 1997. Through this ministry and well before its start in 1997 she comforted many people who were ill or going through a difficult diagnosis with visits and phone calls.

She is a wonderful loving Christian that we are so proud to have serving with us in this church.

In 2000, June along with the help of Parish Nurse Alice Stevenson and Judy Backus began Chat & Chew. Still going strong it is a group of retirees who meet here at the church on Wednesdays at 12:00 noon. Everyone brings their own sack lunch to enjoy in the good company of friends just chatting and chewing. The last several minutes are usually spent singing together with June at the piano keyboard.

The Gilbert Museum located at HD South will be having a June Morrison day on February 13 9:00AM-4:00PM. June will be there in person for one hour at 10:00 AM and again at 2:00 PM. 10 S. Gilbert Road, Gilbert, AZ on the South West Corner of Gilbert and Elliot roads.

On March 17th at 10:30, following the 9:30 service we will celebrated June's 100th Birthday and 75 year membership through a celebration of all of our ministries. Please join us for this celebration to include food, games, prayer, and fun.

Choir Sunday School

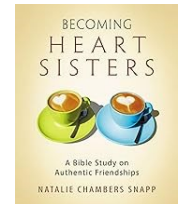
Sundays at 9:45am in room 130, the choir meets weekly. This group facilitates their own bible study. Although primarily choir members, anyone is welcome to join them.



Becoming Heart Sisters

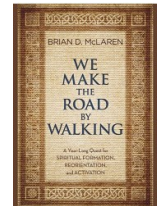
A Bible Study on Authentic Friendships

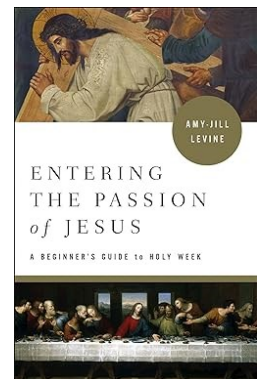
We Make the Road by Walking

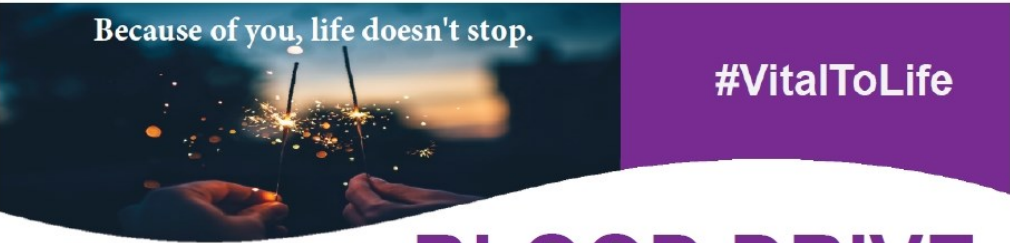

Make your wishes known – A tough talk

On January 2nd, 2023, the world was understandably traumatized after watching the Buffalo Bills NFL player, Damar Hamlin, receive CPR following cardiac arrest in real time on the football field. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) is an emergency lifesaving procedure when the heart stops beating to keep blood flow active. With tragedy, comes conversation. This event has people talking about what they would want for themselves or their loved ones. While it is a difficult topic to approach, this might be a good time to discuss items such as Living Will, Code Status, and POA (Power of Attorney) for health care and finances.

If you find yourself in a hospital setting with the responsibility of making decisions for someone else, the staff can explain Code Status options for you. Please don't hesitate to ask questions as many times as you need to. DNR (Do Not Resuscitate) means that they would not restart the heart with CPR. 90% of people who experience cardiac arrest outside of the hospital die. In the hospital setting, the average survival rate from cardiac arrest is 18%. CPR is necessarily brutal, and chest compressions often result in rib and sternum fractures. DNR does not mean "Do Not Treat". Patients will still receive full medical care including antibiotics, procedures, medications, physical therapy, etc. Opting for a DNR code status would specifically mean not doing CPR with chest compressions if the heart stops.

CPR can double or triple a person's chance of survival. Here are the CPR guidelines for an unresponsive adult without a pulse:

Call 911.

30:2 – 30 compressions then 2 breaths.

Push hard & fast - 2 inches chest depth, 100 times/minute.

Attach AED (automatic external defibrillator) - Just turn it on and follow the prompts.

Change compressor every 2 minutes.

If you choose to include respirations (mouth to mouth), barriers can be purchased to minimize the

The American Heart Association's website educates on CPR topics, including hands free CPR. If you are not certified in CPR, or not sure how to provide rescue breaths, stick to hands-only CPR.

Call 911.

Push hard & fast on the chest in the center just below the nipple line.

The heel of one hand on the center chest, the other on top, interlock fingers.

Straight arms, shoulders over hands, use the upper body for strength.

The Attorney General wants the public to have access to free legal documentation. You can print off a full packet for Living will, POA for healthcare and POA finances at no cost to you. Visit WWW.azag.gov. Click on 'Seniors'. Scroll down to 'Life Care Planning'. Choose 'Complete LCP Packet'.

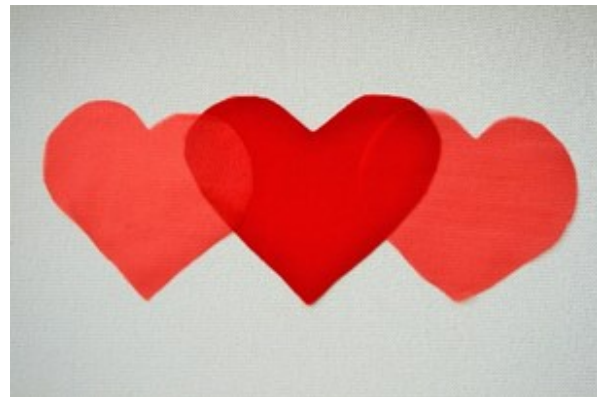

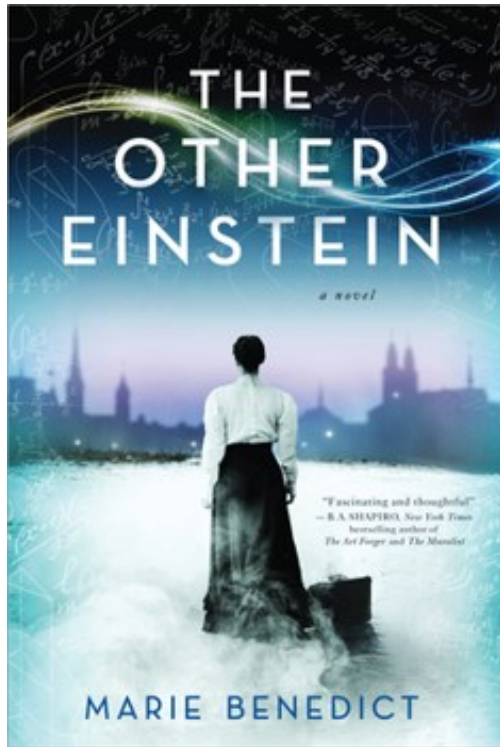

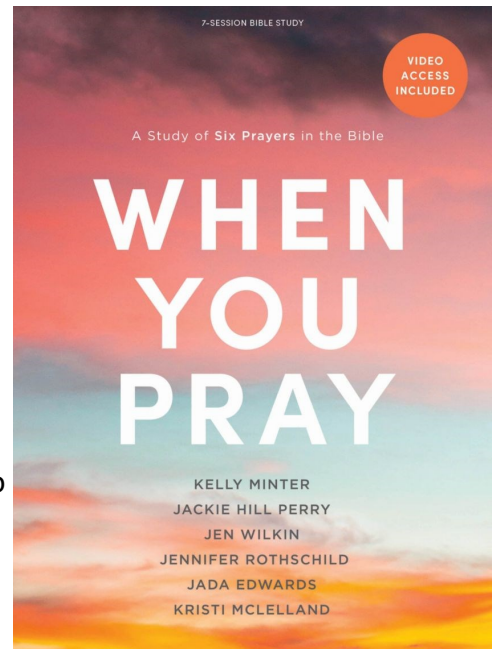

Our hope is to have a large group to add into the discussions. Please feel free to invite a friend or neighbor to the workshop.

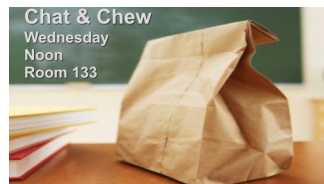

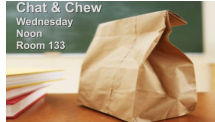

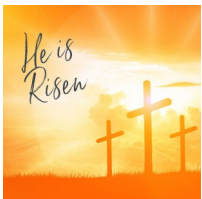
